Section 1 – Introduction

This directory provides a list of CareSource Advantage’s network providers. To get detailed information about your health care coverage, please see your Evidence of Coverage.

You will have to choose one of our network providers that are listed in this directory to be your **P**rietary **C**are **P**rovider (PCP). The term “PCP” will be used throughout this directory. Generally, you must get your health care coverage from your PCP.

When you become a member of CareSource Advantage, you must choose a network provider to be your PCP. Your PCP is a physician who meets state requirements and is trained to give you basic medical care. You will get your routine or basic care from your PCP. Your PCP can also coordinate the rest of the covered services you need. In most cases, you will see your PCP before you see any other health care provider.

The “network providers” listed in this directory have agreed to provide you with your health care coverage. You may go to any of our network providers listed in this directory; however, some services may require a prior authorization. You must use network providers for services to be covered by us at plan cost-sharing levels, except in emergencies, for urgently needed care out of the area, or for out-of-area dialysis services. Please see the CareSource Advantage Evidence of Coverage for more details.

If you have been going to one network provider, you are not required to continue going to that same provider. In some cases, you may get covered services from non-network providers. If you get a bill from a non-network provider, please submit it to CareSource Advantage for processing. We can help determine how much you are responsible for paying, if any.

Emergency care can always be obtained in or out of the service area from the nearest available provider. When in the service area you must use plan providers for urgent care. When out of the service area, urgent care may be obtained from the first available provider. In addition, when out of the service area, you can obtain dialysis treatment from any qualified dialysis provider. If you obtain routine care from out-of-network providers, neither Medicare nor CareSource Advantage will be responsible for the costs. Please call our Member Services Department for help with questions regarding access to non-network providers.
