Mental health remains a critical challenge impacting every community we serve. One way we're addressing this is through the CareSource Invitational, a series of annual college basketball games designed to raise awareness and funds for programs supporting the mental health of children and young adults. This year, we expanded our reach by hosting games in Georgia, Indiana, and Ohio. In addition, pep rallies at local high schools brought coaches and college athletes together to encourage students to prioritize their own mental health. Through these combined efforts, we offered care, hope, and healing that extends far beyond what we could accomplish alone.

In another highlight of 2025, our employees came together in our first annual workplace giving campaign, raising over \$255,000 to support nonprofits serving children and families in Ohio, Indiana, and Georgia. From early literacy programs to initiatives empowering children with disabilities and those in foster care, this outpouring of generosity truly represents who we are. As we look ahead, we remain committed to finding new ways to invest in the communities we serve. Thank you for your partnership and trust. ## CareSource and Habitat for Humanity Strengthen Dayton's Housing Community

In 2025, The CareSource Foundation proudly continued its commitment to supporting safe, stable housing with a \$170,000 grant to Habitat for Humanity of Greater Dayton.

CareSource's contribution funds a mobile critical home repair van, staffed partly by Liberty High School students. These students assist with minor home repairs for older adults, gaining hands-on experience while giving back to their community. Additionally, the students have helped to build a Habitat home in the Edgemont neighborhood during the 2025-26 school year, further demonstrating their dedication to education, service, and the well-being of Dayton's residents.

Together, CareSource and Habitat for Humanity have supported essential home repair programs and launched initiatives that equip young people with practical skills and empower future generations through workforce development.

# Welcoming NATO

Dayton hosted NATO and welcomed over 2,400 guests from across the globe. CareSource was honored to support Congressman Turner in showcasing his hometown on an international stage.



# Transforming Cancer Care Through Exercise

Maple Tree Cancer Alliance is reshaping the cancer care landscape by integrating personalized exercise into treatment, a transformation made possible through the support of The CareSource Foundation.

Since 2011, Maple Tree has provided free, individualized training to patients, focusing on aerobic fitness, flexibility and balance. The structured 12-week exercise program begins with an assessment of each participant's needs and concludes with a follow-up evaluation to measure progress, while a library of exercise videos helps patients sustain their fitness journey beyond the program.

With funding from The CareSource Foundation, Maple Tree is transforming the care experience and improving quality of life for cancer patients. CareSource funding has helped cover program costs for 260 Ohioans, delivering 1,156 customized exercise plans and 8,134 patient touchpoints.

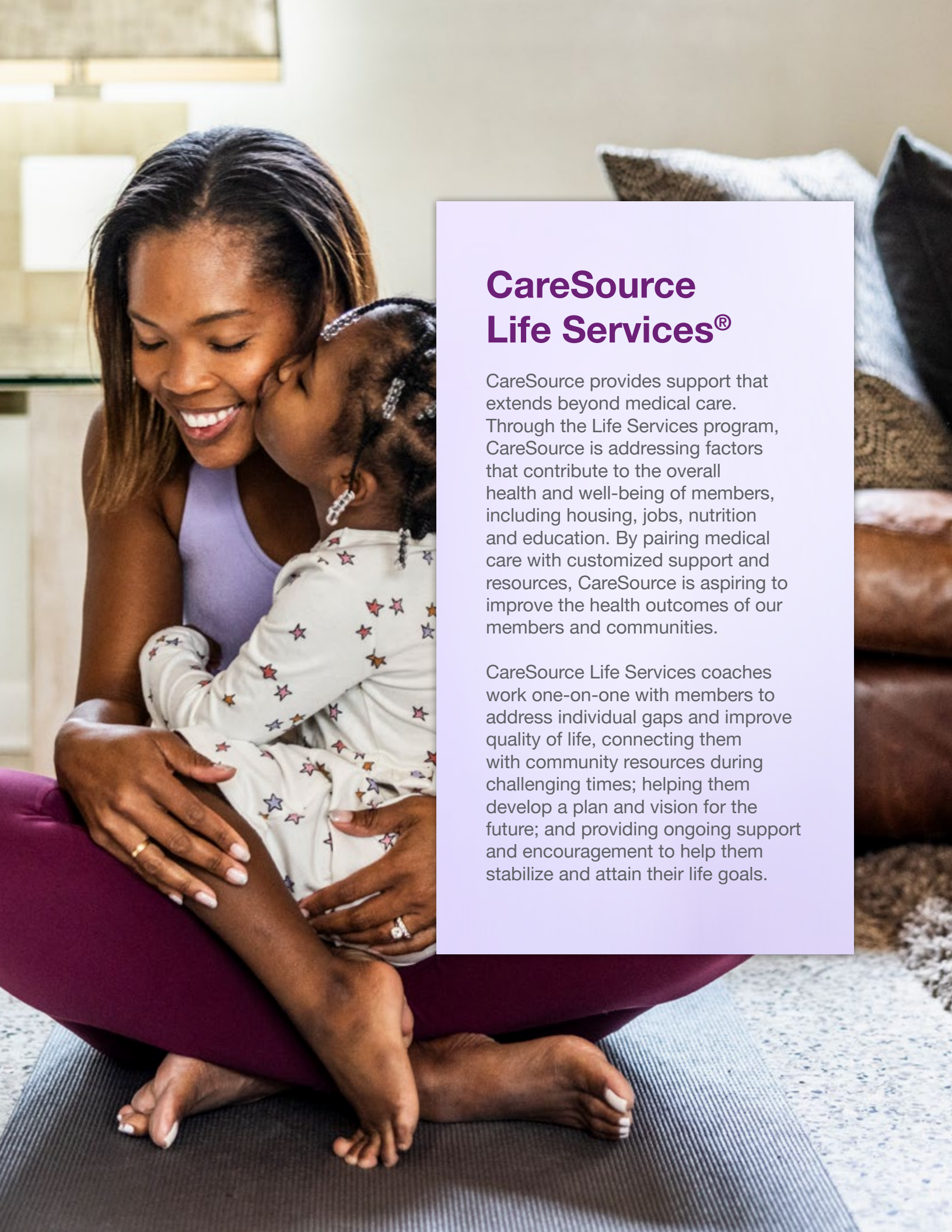

## CareSource Life Services®

CareSource provides support that extends beyond medical care. Through the Life Services program, CareSource is addressing factors that contribute to the overall health and well-being of members, including housing, jobs, nutrition and education. By pairing medical care with customized support and resources, CareSource is aspiring to improve the health outcomes of our members and communities.

CareSource Life Services coaches work one-on-one with members to address individual gaps and improve quality of life, connecting them with community resources during challenging times; helping them develop a plan and vision for the future; and providing ongoing support and encouragement to help them stabilize and attain their life goals.



# Launching a Safety Net for Housing Stability

CareSource understands the importance of stable housing for overall health and well-being. One example of this is in Ohio, where the Emergency Housing Fund, under CareSource's Life Services program, assists members facing temporary financial challenges to avoid homelessness.

CareSource established the fund in partnership with United Way of Summit & Medina, investing \$300,000 to help prevent CareSource members from losing stable housing due to temporary income disruptions, often caused by unexpected circumstances such as illness or short-term unemployment. Since its launch in 2024, the program has distributed \$173,000 in relief funds to assist more than 80 households. The fund has helped vulnerable members retain permanent housing and prevent the risk of worsened health conditions and increased emergency medical costs that often accompany homelessness.

Early data from the program shows that 71% of recipients remained stably housed, resulting in a 65% successful diversion rate from the homeless system. Additionally, there was a 53% decrease in total medical costs for Medicaid members and a 32% decrease for dual-eligible members. The reduced costs indicate a lower need for medical support, improved member outcomes and reduced stress on the health care system.

**Simply put, people are healthier – and their medical costs are lower – when their basic needs are being met, and they can live independently within their communities.**



## Showing Heart Through Crisis Care

CareSource Ohio committed \$1 million to the Franklin County Alcohol, Drug and Mental Health (ADAMH) Board's new Crisis Care Center, to provide a safe and secure location offering a full array of services with integrated peer support at all levels.

"Expanding access to critical behavioral health resources is part of our mission," said Dee Yocum, vice president of CareSource Ohio. "We are proud to partner with the ADAMH Board to support this important new resource and believe it will produce valuable results and supports for those in need."

The Franklin County Crisis Care Center is operated by Recovery Innovations, a behavioral health care nonprofit that has pioneered and operates 24/7 crisis emergency centers in seven states across the United States.

# CareSource Invitational

## It's ok to not be ok

As a nonprofit managed care organization, CareSource is committed to improving the physical and mental well-being of its members at every stage of life. The CareSource Invationals reflect that mission—helping young people build a strong foundation for mental health by providing the tools and support they need to break the stigma and lead more fulfilling, resilient lives. This work is more important than ever, as rates of poor mental health and suicide-related behaviors among adolescents continue to rise.

The CareSource Invationals are a series of exhibition and regular season college basketball games dedicated to raising awareness and funds for adolescent and young adult mental health programs. Each CareSource Invitational pairs college basketball games with high school pep rallies in local communities. The pep rallies deliver engaging mental health education and raise awareness of resources that can provide much-needed support. The CareSource Foundation also supports local organizations in each community included in the Invitational - totaling \$325,000 in grants as part of the 2025 Invitational.

# Supporting with Heart

## Dayton Children's Hospital

Dayton Children's has broken ground on a new urgent care facility in West Dayton, enhancing access to pediatric care.

This initiative is bolstered by a \$1.5 million donation from CareSource, supporting both the urgent care and broader community health efforts.

# Take Flight Program

## The CareSource Foundation's grant support of Wright State University's Take Flight program helps remove financial barriers

by covering up to 18 undergraduate credit hours each semester for up to 4 years—allowing students to focus on learning, belonging, and progressing toward graduation.

The program is growing, driven by increasing interest and institutional support, with CareSource's contributions playing a significant role in expanding student opportunities:

- Fall 2023: 209 students
- Fall 2024: 246 students
- Fall 2025: 252 students

Students have demonstrated a commitment to continuing in the program, with more and more Take Flight students returning each year for the Spring semester: 89% of the Fall 2022 cohort returned in Spring, increasing to 92% in Fall 2023 and reaching 94% in Fall 2024.

Through the Take Flight program, CareSource and Wright State University have shown how collaboration between community organizations and higher education institutions can significantly support students' academic goals.

# Show Up, Rise Up

The Show Up, Rise Up program is a partnership between CareSource and Middletown City Schools.

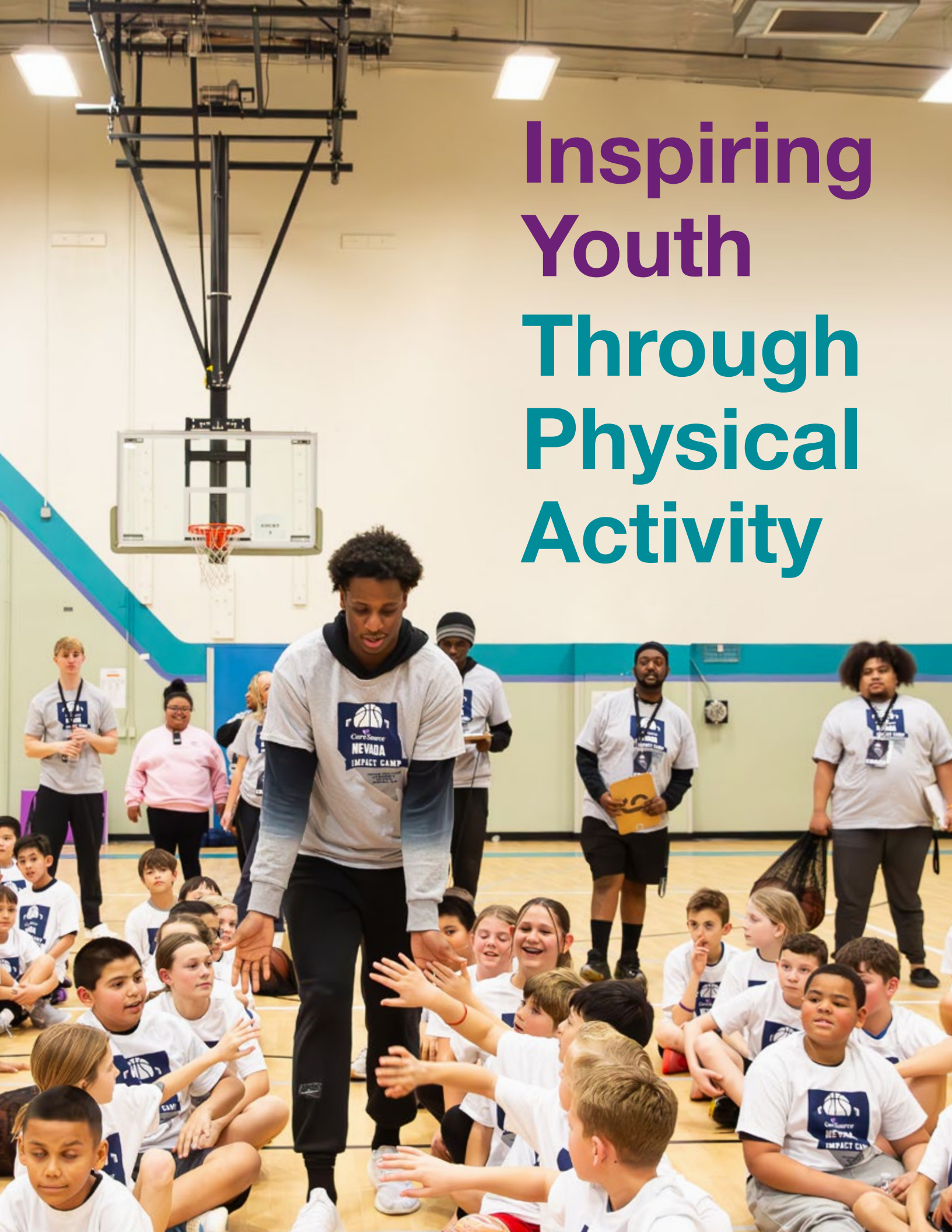
Aimed at reducing chronic absenteeism among students in grades 7–12, Show Up, Rise Up offers incentive-based strategies such as gift cards and raffles awarded for perfect attendance to motivate students to attend school and stay engaged.

The program launched in 2025 with a Pep Rally featuring Cincinnati Bengals running back Chase Brown. His appearance jumpstarted student involvement, and Brown’s message about the importance of “showing up” highlighted the value of consistency—not just in sports, but also in academics and daily responsibilities.

Weekly attendance data showed that Show Up, Rise Up consistently helped stabilize or increase attendance, reversing negative trends and resulting in a 5-percentage-point drop in chronic absenteeism. The program also offered valuable insights into the barriers students face, helping the school district to better align future attendance strategies with student services, wellness supports, and transportation needs.



# Inspiring Youth Through Physical Activity





## CareSource Nevada partnered with the Boys & Girls Club of Truckee Meadows and the UNR Men's Basketball team to host a youth impact camp in Reno.

The event, held at the Donald W. Reynolds Boys & Girls Club, encouraged physical activity and teamwork through structured exercise with collegiate athletes.

Led by UNR Head Coach Steve Alford and players Chuck Bailey, Justin McBride, and Amire Robinson, the camp featured basketball drills and activities. During the event,

CareSource honored Coach Alford with the "Heart of the Community" award for his dedication to youth programs and community well-being in Northern Nevada.

This initiative is part of CareSource's broader effort to enhance health and wellness in Nevada, focusing on improving health outcomes for underserved populations.



## Our Future Health Care Heroes

The CareSource Foundation proudly sponsored Little Medical School (LMS) at Dayton Boys & Girls Club. LMS was developed to spark curiosity and confidence in the next generation of health care professionals.

Over 100 bright young minds graduated from the program following a special two-day event allowing students to explore exciting careers in the health care field.

Thanks to the support and expertise of Wright State University Boonshoft School of Medicine and Premier Health Partners, participants had hands-on experiences that brought medical professions to life — from learning basic clinical skills to discovering what it's like to be a doctor, nurse or EMT.



## Victory Project

**For the past ten years, The CareSource Foundation has supported the work of The Victory Project in helping at-risk youth connect with employment and wraparound mental health supports.**

The Victory Project is an after-school program specializing in mentoring up to 100 students aged 12 to 18 annually at their two facilities in Dayton. CareSource's most recent \$75,000 grant in 2025 will help The Victory Project expand to a third site.

The Victory Project curriculum provides stability, purpose, and belonging — core elements of long-term health. By integrating faith-based mentorship with workforce and academic development, the program helps students not only avoid negative influences, but also become thriving, self-sufficient adults who contribute positively to their communities.

# Hearts for Hope Gala



**As CareSource embraces its national grant footprint,** the 2025 inaugural Hearts for Hope Gala engaged national partners in the mission of The CareSource Foundation in supporting existing and emerging communities in the CareSource family.



Hosted in September at a beautiful site in Cincinnati, the Hearts for Hope Gala proved a successful and crucial initiative to support The CareSource Foundation. The Gala raised \$700,000 for the Foundation, engaged 75 corporate vendors, and included nearly 400 sponsor attendees. The next gala will take place in 2027!

# Across Our Markets



## Massachusetts

Commonwealth Care Alliance (CCA), part of the CareSource family of companies, is proud of our long-term partnerships with community-based safety net organizations like Lynn Community Health Center (LCHC). 2025 marked CCA's eighth year supporting LCHC's Mobile Market, a food distribution operation in partnership with the Greater Boston Food Bank (GBFB), that provides on average 10,000 pounds of food to 450 households on the first Saturday of every month.

Additionally, during our two annual Day of Service events, employees contributed another 1,400 volunteer hours to organizations such as Habitat for Humanity, the Food Bank of Western Massachusetts, the Brown Bag: Food for Elders program, Community Servings, and A Bed for Every Child.

## Nevada

CareSource Nevada is proud to support mission-aligned organizations across the state, working collaboratively to enhance community health and well-being. Our partnership with Communities in Schools of Nevada is aimed at providing essential resources and support to students, helping ensure they have the tools needed for academic success.

To help address food insecurity, CareSource Nevada collaborated with Three Square Food Bank and the Food Bank of Northern Nevada to support the creation of a Rural Food Hub in Elko, NV, as well as prescription food pantries and children's programs that provide fresh produce to families. Together, these partnerships are making a meaningful impact on the lives of Nevadans.



## Wisconsin

CareSource is proud to support a broad range of community-based organizations across the state that provide critical services in health care, mental health, hunger relief, and social support.

In 2025, CareSource support of the Hunger Task Force enabled the distribution of nutritious food to combat food insecurity across the region.

Common Ground Healthcare Cooperative, part of the CareSource family of companies, partnered with Best Buddies Wisconsin, an organization creating life-changing friendships and employment opportunities for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

Additionally, The CareSource Foundation contributed to partners such as:

- Northlakes Community Clinic, which delivers vital health care to underserved rural populations in northern Wisconsin
- Innovative Care Services in Ashwaubenon, which offers personalized support to individuals with developmental disabilities
- The Center for Suicide Awareness in Kaukauna and Community for Hope in Oshkosh, both of which advance suicide prevention and recovery services
- Bread of Healing and City on a Hill, two Milwaukee organizations that promote holistic wellness and aid homeless youth and families

Through these ongoing partnerships, CareSource remains committed to creating stronger, healthier, and more inclusive communities throughout the state.



## Georgia

In 2025, The CareSource Foundation launched a grant challenge to award organizations \$75,000 each for their work addressing non-clinical drivers of health, including four Georgia organizations.

Rural communities may struggle to access the healthy food they need to thrive. That's why in 2025 CareSource awarded a grant to Atrium Health Floyd to expand access to fresh produce and nutritional resources for low-income families. This investment also helped grow school-based health programs which serve more than 24,000 students and 2,400 staff members in Floyd, Rome City and Polk County schools.

Committed to helping older adults stay engaged in their communities, CareSource funded grants to East Georgia Healthcare Center's *Engage, Enrich, Empower a Healthy Community* initiative and the Sowega Council on Aging's programs to improve accessibility, help seniors stay active and connect them to community through technology. CareSource's grant to Albany Area Primary Health Care Inc. funds social work engagement, patient navigation, and access to maternal health education and group resources.

Georgia ranks third in the nation for rural hospital closures. To address the financial strain many rural hospitals are facing, CareSource partnered with HomeTown Health beginning in 2024 to create the Rural Access Advancement Program (RAAP). With an innovative funding model that provides emergency, repayable funding to hospitals facing critical cash flow challenges, hospitals can maintain operations and remain open to care for their communities. Once repaid, funds are reinvested into the program, creating a sustainable funding pipeline for additional hospitals.

In 2024, Hurricane Helene devastated Georgia's agricultural sector, resulting in billions of dollars in losses across the state's agriculture and forestry industries. To support farmers in their recovery, CareSource donated \$40,000 to the Georgia Foundation for Agriculture (GFA). The funding bolstered the Weathered But Strong: Georgia Hurricane Relief Fund, which provided critical financial assistance to family-owned and generational farms affected by the hurricane.

Additionally, The CareSource Foundation has invested \$100,000 to expand farmer mental health support throughout the state. This funding supports peer support, youth-focused wellness pilots and community leader training programs delivered through the Georgia Foundation for Agriculture (GFA), Georgia Farm Bureau Network, and the Georgia Agricultural Wellness Alliance (GAWA).



In 2025, CareSource Georgia also partnered with Ready2CONNECT powered by Action Pact Inc., a nonprofit career-readiness organization, to expand workforce development opportunities in Effingham and Chatham counties. A \$25,000 contribution from CareSource provided tailored case management and scholarships toward a pharmacy technician certification program, equipping participants with skills needed to build a sustainable career.

To help break down barriers to education and employment, CareSource Georgia teamed up with Eckerd Connects, a national nonprofit organization providing workforce resources for at-risk youth, adults, and families. This collaboration identified members participating in the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) and created individualized employment support plans based on a skills and challenges assessment. CareSource also contributed \$10,000 for an on-site food pantry to provide members enrolled in the program with access to healthy meals and snacks.

Nearly 15% of families in Georgia are food insecure, highlighting the need for community support to improve access to healthy meals. In continued response to this need, CareSource provided fresh produce and shelf-stable food in Albany, Gainesville, and Atlanta through partnerships with the Georgia Mountain Food Bank, Atlanta Community Food Bank, the Black Farmer's Co-Op, and the Latin American Association. These contributions were enhanced with vital health and wellness services onsite.
