Welcome to P4HB®

This program is to help:

- Give family planning services to women.
- Have more time between births.
- Have less low birth weight (LBW) and very low birth weight (VLBW) births. This is done through planning, health education and vitamins.
- Give Inter-Pregnancy Care (IPC) to women who have had a VLBW baby.





About P4HB®

You are part of one of these three programs:



Family Planning ID Cards are Pink

Inter-Pregnancy Care (IPC) ID Cards are Purple

Resource Mother Outreach (RMO) ID Cards are Yellow



How To Be Part of P4HB®

To be part of P4HB® Family Planning, you must:



Be a woman between the ages of 18-44.



Be a U.S. citizen with proof.



Live in Georgia.



Not part of other insurance programs.



Have a family gross income of no more than 211% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL).

IPC must also:

Meet the Family Planning requirements and delivered a VLBW baby on or after 1/1/2011.

RMO must also:

Have Georgia Families full benefits and had a VLBW baby on or after 1/1/2011.



P4HB® Disenrollment

You can no longer be in P4HB® if you:

- Become pregnant.
- Have a sterilization procedure and all follow ups.
- Are not able to be pregnant.
- Move out of Georgia.
- Become incarcerated.
- Have a change in income and are able to join a different insurance program.
- Are over 44 years of age.

- CareSource cannot make this change for you.



Family Planning

- Check your P4HB® ID card to see if a Family Planning Provider is listed.



Family Planning Primary Care Services

A Primary Care Provider (PCP) is where you go for health care like:

- Vaccines (shots)
- Check-ups
- Physicals
- Aches, pains
- Illness

The P4HB® program does not cover primary care. The Georgia Primary Care Association can help you.

P4HB® Benefits

Family Planning members have these benefits:

- Family planning annual exams
- Follow-up family planning visits
- Contraceptive (birth control) services and supplies
- Pregnancy tests and pap smears
- Testing, medicine and follow up for sexually transmitted infections (STIs) found during annual exams. Does not include HIV/AIDS and hepatitis.
- Tubal ligation (sterilization)
- Family planning pharmacy visits
- Counseling and referrals to social services and primary health care
- Vitamins/folic acid
- Select immunizations for members ages 19 and 20. Members age 18 get vaccines at no cost.
- Limited Inpatient and ER services-for Family Planning services and/or complications only.
- May have out-of-network provider services



P4HB® Services Not Covered

- Chiropractic (back doctor) services
- Abortions (ending pregnancy) or abortion-related services
- Partial dentures
- Disposables (throwaways) like diapers, cotton or bandages
- Cosmetic surgery
- Experimental (trial) and investigational items
- Hysterectomy (removal of the uterus)
- In-patient and Emergency Room visits for services unrelated to a family planning related service and/or complication such as broken bones
- Family Planning case management
- Family Planning services to a woman who is known to be pregnant
- Sterilization when institutionalized in correctional facilities, mental hospitals, or other facilities
- Infertility assessment services (review, education, exam, lab tests and counseling)
- Infertility referrals
- Treatment for HIV and Hepatitis (screening only)
- Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) shot
- Vision services (eye exams)
- OB visits and prenatal care

IPC Benefits

All the Family Planning Benefits, plus:

- Primary care: five office/outpatient visits
- Management and treatment of chronic diseases by a PCP only
- Substance abuse treatment: detox and intensive outpatient rehabilitation (rehab)
- Case management including Resource Mother outreach
- Limited dental services
- Prescription drugs for chronic diseases (non-family planning)
- Transportation (rides): up to six round trip rides per year to covered services. To set up a trip, call at least three business days before your visit. Call Member Services 1-855-202-0729 (TTY: 1-800-255-0056 or 711).



RMO Benefits

Resource Mother members get care management services such as:

- Help dealing with health care and social needs
- Referrals to social services in your area
- Counseling services
- Help getting needed medication (drugs)
- Links to community resources for mothers

Your Care Team Member will help set you up with health care services. They will review your care plan as needed. Medical related services are covered under your Medicaid benefit plan.

Special Benefits

- Women who are part of IPC will be disenrolled after two years. They may move to Family Planning if they are eligible.
- P4HB® eligibility redeterminations are done at least every 12 months.
- You must be at least 21 years of age for sterilization and voluntary informed consent and mentally competent.
