Summary

The CareSource Life Services program is a free service that addresses the non-clinical needs of our members, focusing on social determinants of health (SDoH).

Impact

Socioeconomic factors such as education, employment, food availability and safety have a direct impact on a person's health and wellness. The CareSource Life Services life coaches work with our members to mitigate issues and remove barriers that impede progress toward self-sufficiency and improved health and well-being.

The CareSource Life Services program includes 4 pillars of support:

- **WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT** CareSource JobConnect™ addresses needs and goals related to employment or education.
- **HOUSING** Life Services facilitates linkage to community partners who focus on housing stability, advocacy, and financial tools.
- **FOOD AND NUTRITION** Life coaches address food insecurity by improving access to food and nutrition education.
- **HEALTH EQUITY** Coaching focuses on reduction in health disparities through education, engagement, awareness of and response to discrimination, improve job access, fair pay, quality education and health care and safe environments.

Importance

Members who work with our Life Coaches experience improved positive outcomes with their overall health and our claims data show that CareSource JobConnect participants are less likely to frequent the Emergency Department.

Referral criteria –

- CareSource Georgia Medicaid members or parent/legal guardian of a CareSource Georgia Medicaid member
- Over 16 years old
- Interested in opting into the Life Services program
