Subject: New Process for Clinical Practice Guideline (CPG) Audits

Summary

The Georgia Department of Community Health (DCH) has revised the process for quarterly Clinical Practice Guideline (CPG) audits.

Impact

To ensure consistent compliance with evidence-based care, DCH requires all Georgia Medicaid Care Management Organizations (CMOs) to complete quarterly CPG audits on a random selection of medical records for three diagnoses. Per DCH's revised process, CareSource will audit providers on CPGs for depression, diabetes (as before), and hypertension utilizing new audit tools created by DCH. Providers will be audited for **one** of the three diagnoses for the year. The CPG audits for ADHD and asthma have been discontinued.

Each DCH audit tool includes specific quality indicators (required documentation) that CareSource must look for in the medical records. Providers will receive formal audit results in writing. If providers score less than 80% on any indicators, CareSource will perform targeted reaudits for the applicable indicators after a minimum of 90 days to reassess compliance and take additional steps to support providers with improvement as designated by DCH.
