Subject: Closing Diabetes Retinopathy Screening Care Gaps

Summary

According to the CDC, <u>diabetes is the leading cause of vision loss in people 18-64 years old</u>¹. An annual routine eye exam <u>could prevent 95% of vision loss</u> caused by diabetes².

Importance

Please ensure that the codes attached are added to your claim to clinically inform us of a completed eye exam and retinopathy status.

Diabetes Care Gaps

- ➤ Please be sure to test your patient's A1C at least twice a year for those patients who are 18 years or older and have Type 1 or 2 diabetes. Please document the result in the patient's chart.
- Add codes indicating diabetes eye exam with <u>or</u> without evidence of retinopathy to a claim and include the correct diagnosis.

This will help identify members who need eye exams every year (with retinopathy) or whose eye exams are good for two years (with no evidence of retinopathy).
