> Description

The implementation of ICD-10 <u>does not</u> change requirements for when dental providers need to submit a diagnosis code on a claim. ODM is simply providing the following *ICD-10 TIPS* to remind dental providers of diagnosis code requirements.

Since dental providers are not currently required to submit ICD-9 diagnosis codes when billing dental claims (ADA form based claims), these providers will not be required to submit an ICD-10 diagnosis code on dental claims (ADA form based claims) on or after the October 1, 2015 (10/1/15) ICD-10 compliance date.

However, since dental providers are currently required to submit ICD-9 diagnosis codes when billing professional claims (CMS-1500 form based claims), these providers will be required to submit an ICD-10 diagnosis code on professional claims (CMS-1500 form based claims) on or after the 10/1/15 ICD-10 compliance date.

> Managed Care Considerations

This ICD-10 TIPS applies to both fee-for-service and managed care billing.
