Subject: ICD-10 Training Needs and Provider Checklist

Humana – CareSource encourages all physicians and health care providers to continue progress toward International Statistical Classification of Diseases, 10th Revision (ICD-10) compliance. The transition to the ICD-10 code set is scheduled for Oct. 1, 2015. The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) recommends the following training timelines for ICD-10 preparation:

- Coders who will not assign ICD-10 Clinical Management (CM)/Procedure Coding System (PCS) codes until the compliance date need six to nine months of training prior to implementation.
- Hospital inpatient coders need 50 hours of training for ICD-10-CM and ICD-10-PCS code sets prior to implementation.
- Other coders need 16 hours of training for ICD-10-CM prior to implementation.

Per CMS, ICD-10 coding training will be integrated into the continuing education units (CEUs) that certified coders must take to maintain their credentials.

ICD-10 resources and training materials are available through CMS, professional associations and societies, and software vendors.

ICD-10 Provider Checklist

- Confirm with your practice's billing service, clearinghouses and practice management software vendors that they are ready to provide the support needed to meet the compliance deadline.
- 2. Identify touchpoints in your systems and business processes that need to be changed.
- 3. Determine if updates to billing forms are needed for compliance.
