Humana – CareSource wants to remind physicians that the International Classification of Diseases code set, 10th revision (ICD-10), implementation date is Oct. 1, 2015. Humana – CareSource encourages all health partners to continue their work toward ICD-10 compliance. Taking initiative now to improve clinical documentation will help you ensure a smoother transition to ICD-10 for your coding staff and patients you serve.
