
About 50,000 children visit the emergency room each year because they took medications that were within reach.



In the last few years, there have been over 30,000 overdose deaths from prescription drugs each year.



Most people who first misuse prescription drugs get them from their friends or family members.



Do you have old drugs in your cupboards or medicine cabinets? Check the expiration date.

Are you still taking the medicines? If not, you should get rid of them. Leftover medications are a big health risk. They can be a danger to toddlers, teens and family pets. Get rid of old drugs the safe way before they can cause harm.



THERE ARE STEPS YOU CAN TAKE RIGHT NOW:



A DisposeRx[®] packet to help you with the safe disposal of your unused medications. Not disposing of unused medications makes them more available to be misused by others.
