## **National Provider Identifier Classification Summary**

All individuals and organizations that are healthcare providers doing business with the IHCP must obtain the proper type of National Provider Identifier (NPI). There are two types of healthcare provider NPIs:

- > Type 1 (individual) A healthcare provider that is conducting business as an individual or as a sole proprietor must obtain a Type 1 NPI.
- ➤ Type 2 (organizational) A healthcare provider that is conducting business as an organization or a distinct subpart of an organization, such as a group practice, a facility, or a corporation, including an incorporated individual, must also obtain a Type 2 NPI.

Note: A healthcare provider rendering healthcare services as an individual practitioner and also conducting business as an incorporated entity, must obtain a Type 1 NPI as a practitioner and also a Type 2 NPI as a corporation or limited liability company (LLC). Atypical providers may submit with either an NPI or IHCP Provider Identifier.

## **NPI Validation and Taxonomy Code Highlights**

The IHCP uses a crosswalk to establish a unique match between a Billing Provider's NPI and IHCP Provider Identifier. The crosswalk must successfully identify a unique IHCP Provider Service Location. The group or billing provider's NPI and taxonomy code will continue to be required in the header of managed care claims – for all claim types, when there are multiple service locations.

Three data elements are used in the crosswalk to identify a unique location if the NPI is associated with multiple service locations:

- ➤ NPI Loop 2010AA NM109
- > Taxonomy Code (if sent) Loop 2000A PRV03
- ➤ Billing Provider Service Location Zip Code Loop 2010AA N403



If the crosswalk does not establish a unique one-to-one match for the billing provider, the claim may reject or deny in claims processing. A provider using the same taxonomy and NPI for multiple service locations, will need to insure each location is registered with correct service location address and zip plus+4.
