ICD-10 Transition Tips for Health Care Providers

Humana – CareSource wants to remind health care providers that the transition to International Classification of Diseases and Related Health Problems, 10th revision (ICD-10) takes place Oct. 1, 2015.

This notification contains a set of prepared tips to assist our health care providers with questions and concerns so you are ready to submit claims using ICD-10 codes on Oct. 1:

- Identify and prepare current practices in your office that use ICD-9 codes, including office visit forms, health record systems, contracts and public health and quality reporting protocols, for the transition.
- Work with software vendors that provide your practice with systems such as provider management and clinical documenting to understand how each system will accommodate ICD-10 codes. Check your contract to ensure system upgrades are included.
- Shop for new systems that are compliant with the ICD-10 code set.
- Talk with clearinghouses, billing services and payers you work with to work out plans for testing.
- Identify staff responsible for coding and create a training plan suitable for their needs.
