Summary

According to the CDC, [diabetes is the leading cause of vision loss in people 18-64 years old](#)¹. An annual routine eye exam [could prevent 95% of vision loss](#) caused by diabetes².

Importance

Please ensure that the codes attached are added to your claim to clinically inform us of retinopathy.

Diabetes Care Gaps

- Check A1C test for eligible CareSource members who are 18+ years old who have diabetes (Type 1 or 2) and document in the chart
- Add codes indicating diabetes eye exam with **or** without evidence of Retinopathy to a claim and include the correct diagnosis

This will also help identify members who need eye exams every year (with retinopathy) or whose eye exams are good for 2 years (without no evidence of retinopathy).

E13.9	Other specified DM without complications	ICD10CM

2022F	Dilated retinal eye exam (DRE) with interpretation by an ophthalmologist (OPTH) or optometrist (OPT) documented/reviewed; with retinopathy DM	CPT-CAT-II
2024F	*Retinal Exam/photos with interpretation by OPTH/OPT with retinopathy DM	CPT-CAT-II
2026F	Eye imaging match retinal photos results documented/reviewed; with retinopathy DM	CPT-CAT-II
2023F	DRE exam with interpretation by an OPTH/OPT documented/reviewed; without evidence of retinopathy DM	CPT-CAT-II
2025F	*Retinal photos with interpretation by OPTH/OPT without evidence of retinopathy DM	CPT-CAT-II

2033F	Eye imaging validated to match diagnosis *retinal photos results documented/reviewed; without evidence of retinopathy DM	CPT-CAT-II
