Subject: Georgia Medicaid Short-Acting Opioid Limits for Acute Pain
Effective Date: July 15, 2018

Attention Health Partners:

On 07/15/2018, CareSource will be implementing a change to criteria and quantity limits for opioids for members with acute pain. There are conditions that are exempt from the limits above including cancer related pain, palliative care, end-of-life or hospice care, sickle cell disease, severe burns, traumatic crushing of tissue, amputation, and major orthopedic surgery. There are instances where you may need to submit a prior authorization indicating the member has one of the conditions that are exempt.

The new limits that will be implemented are:

Effective July 15, 2018

- Maximum 7 day supply on prescriptions for a treatment naïve patient*
- Maximum, cumulative 14 day supply in a 45 day period for a treatment naïve patient*
- Maximum average 90 morphine equivalent dose (MED) per day for both opiate naïve* and chronic utilizers

Effective October 1, 2018

- Maximum average 60 morphine equivalent dose (MED) per day for both opiate naïve* and chronic utilizers

*CareSource defines a treatment naïve patient as a member who has been prescribed less than a 60 day supply of opioids within the last 365 days.
