# Summary

The American College of Obstetrics and Gynecology (ACOG) recommends all post-partum members receive Post-Partum Depression (PPD) screening. Individuals who experience post-partum depression are more likely to have less than ideal outcomes for themselves and/or their newborn baby.

# Impact

PPD is highly treatable and early identification is key. This screening may be completed by the pediatrician or OB/GYN health care provider and is reimbursable when billed with CPT<sup>®</sup> code 96160\*.

# Importance

ACOG recommends PPD screening for all recently delivered mothers. It is a best practice to identify individuals experiencing depression symptoms as early as possible to ensure appropriate treatment.
